

INSTRUCTIONS FOR VISITORS – COVID-19
(Government Gazette 5401/B'/20-11-2021)

**WE WELCOME YOU TO THE MUSEUM OF BYZANTINE CULTURE AND THE WHITE
TOWER.**

**FOR EVERYONES HEALTH PROTECTION, PLEASE FOLLOW THE HYGIENE
INTRUCTIONS BEFORE AND DURING YOUR VISIT TO THE MUSEUM.**

Audience and visitors aged 18 years old and over are required to enter the museum by displaying:

- A) Vaccination certificate or
- B) Disease certificate issued 30 days after the initial positive test and its validity lasts up to 180 days after that
In combination, for the identity check, visitors must:
display their identity card, or driver's license or another proof of identity.
The above certificates are displayed either in paper form or electronically via a mobile device and are being scanned by the employee through the Covid-free Gr.
Alternatively if the foreign visitor comes from a country outside the E.U., the above certificates are checked in paper form.
- C) Children from 4 to 17 years old can submit a statement of a negative 24-hour self test made by either a parent or a guardian.

Sanitary instructions

Observance of the appropriate distances of at least 1,5 meters indoors or outdoors.

One (1) person per 2 m².

Obligatory use of a protective mask.

Avoid touching parts of the face (eyes, nose and mouth).

Hand washing with liquid soap and water.

Use of an alcoholic antiseptic solution with a minimum content of 70% ethyl alcohol.

Non-use of hand dryers machine (it has been disconnected).

Evacuation of the toilet bowl with closed lid.

Group Visits:

When visiting groups the distances and the prescribed measures should be strictly observed, the use of wireless tour should be used and the use of common devices (tablets, headphones, etc.) should be avoided.

In our museums there is a controlled flow of visitors per room. Please follow the instructions of the Guard staff.
